Community Benefit Grant Program

Purpose

- Provide financial support to community organizations to delivering health-related services or programs
- Fund grant programs aligned with strategic health priorities

- Trauma Care and Violence Prevention Workgroup of the Community Advisory Council (TCVP)

Overview of Grants

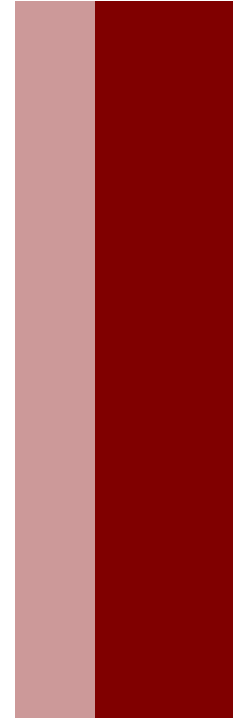
Focus for FY 2019 Funding

Violence Prevention

- Proven or promising practices in violence prevention
- \$25-50K for 1 year

Collective Impact

- New or existing coalitions working collectively on violence prevention
- Up to \$50k for 1 year
- Possibility of renewal for 2 more years based on progress and availability of funding

Eligibility Criteria

- Applicant must be a 501(c)(3) nonprofit community-based organization
- Applicant must either be located in and/or deliver the majority (51%) of programming in one or more of the following communities: Woodlawn, South Shore, South Chicago, Greater Grand Crossing, Washington Park, and Bronzeville.
- Proposals must include SMART objectives (Specific, Measureable, Attainable, Realistic, and Time)
- Track progress following indicators aligned with strategic framework and evaluation measures

Exclusions

Grants requesting the following types of support are excluded and will not be considered:

- Applications from partisan political organizations.
- Applications from for-profit organizations.
- Applications requesting support for fund raising activities such as sponsorships, advertising or event tickets.
- Applications from individuals.
- Applications for memorials or endowments.
