#### Some reasons you may want to call the Pediatric Surgery APN:

- You have concerns with the way the skin around the G-Tube looks.
- There is a lot of leaking around the G-Tube.
- You want to come in to the G-Tube clinic to have your child seen (you can also just make an appointment).
- You have a question about G-Tube supplies used to give the feeding.
- The G-Tube broke or fell out and you are not sure what to do (See: What to do if the G-Tube falls out).



#### When to Call:

### Your Durable Medical Equipment Provider (DME):

- Your DME delivers your G-Tube supplies and may also provide your feeds
- If you have problems with supply delivery or amount delivered-call them directly

## Your PCP (Primary Care Doctor) or GI Provider (Gastroenterologist):

- If you have questions about the type or amount of feeding you are giving your child
- If you are having issues with your child tolerating their feeding

#### The G-Tube Manufacturer:

If your G-Tube breaks early (less than 3 months old) see section called:
